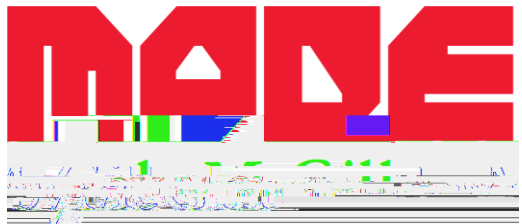




Established in honor of Don for my father, John William Mosson (1932-2021)



John William Mosson (1932-2021) received his Bachelor's degree in Mining Engineering from McGill University in 1955. He worked for the industry for 15 years before returning to McGill to recruit students into Mining Engineering and had an important role in increasing the number of women and non-engineers in the program. John was a driving force in instilling a sense of community, constantly encouraging students, and organizing opportunities for them to socialize among themselves and network with industry and academic partners from the mining community. John is also remembered for being gifted at helping students in any way. To many, he was the epitome of a mining engineer: worldly, adventurous, outdoorsy, and gregarious.
